

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Early Head Start (EHS) & Community Partnerships

Community partnerships are essential to offering comprehensive services in EHS:

- Community planning improves the delivery of services [Head Start Program Performance Standards (HSPPS) 1304.41 (a)(1)]
- Collaborative relationships with community organizations promotes access to responsive services [HSPPS 1304.41(a)(2)(ii)]





CHILDREN & FAMILIES

EHS and Family Partnerships

EHS programs strengthen family resilience by:

- Building collaborative partnership between EHS and parents to support family goals [HSPPS 1304.40(a)(1)]
- Developing and implementing family partnership agreements that describe family goals [HSPPS 1304.40 (a)(2)]
- Coordinating with other community agencies to avoid duplication of services [HSPPS 1304.40(a)(3)]



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EHS & HS Collaboration in PA

For over 20 years, Healthy Start, Inc. and Council of Three Rivers American Indian Center EHS in Pittsburgh, PA have partnered on different activities.

This partnership initially formed to:

- Reduce and maintain low rates of infant mortality
- Promote healthy and early childhood development
- Encourage school readiness







Collaborative Case Management in EHS & HS in FL

Gadsden Federal Healthy Start Project & Florida State Univ. EHS in FL provide collaborative case management:

- Reduces duplication of services
- Ensures effective and timely access to services
- Supports family engagement and connection to community resources.





Strategies to Build or Continue EHS/HS Collaboration



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- Develop a shared vision
- Identify a common goal
- Take time to cultivate relationships
- Collaborate on 2-3 activities
- Provide feedback on collaborative activities
- Assess partnership progress and needs
- Refine goals and activities based
 on organizational priorities
