Benefits of Breastfeeding for Mom & Infant

Benefits to Mom

- Easier to do and less items needed (after breastfeeding is established)
- Saves \$1,500 a year
- Promotes bonding between mother and baby
- Reduces risk for developing type 2 diabetes, breast and ovarian cancers, and postpartum depression

Benefits to Infant

- Protects against certain illnesses
- Reduces lower respiratory infections, ear infections, and diarrhea
- Reduces the occurrence of asthma, obesity, and type 2 diabetes

Benefits of Breastfeeding for Society

- If 90% of families breastfed, approximately 1,000 infant deaths could be prevented
- \$13 billion per year saved in medical/health care costs
- Creates a healthier environment with less trash and waste

Healthy People 2020 Breastfeeding Goal

- Increase infants born who ever breastfed from 75% (in 2010) to 82%
- Increase infants born who are exclusively breastfed for six months from 43% (in 2010) to 61%


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Head Start Program Performance Standards

According to HSPPS CFR 1304(c)(3), EHS/HS programs serving pregnant women:

- Must provide the benefits of breastfeeding to pregnant and nursing moms
- Provide arrangements in center-based programs for moms who choose to breastfeed
