

Core Knowledge and Competencies (CKCs): Foundation of PD Systems

- Assess PD content, gaps, and needs
- Demonstrate alignment of PD content
- Inform PD development and revisions
- □ Facilitate recognition of PD across sectors
- Facilitate transfer and articulation within and across States/Territories/Tribes

Shared Framework



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When CKCs are informed by accepted professional standards, they create a shared framework across an aligned PD system

Shared Framework

- A shared framework facilitates the development of PD that can be:
 - Stackable from one level to the next
 - Commonly accepted across settings, sectors, and related systems
 - Portable acrossStates/Territories/Tribes

Why Portability Matters

- Approximately 1/3 of all US college students transfer
- Supports a workforce with longevity
 - Sustain careers and develop skills over time
 - Changes in residency, role, and settings



PD Capacity and Access

- Pre- and inservice opportunities for
 - Continuity of care as a strategy to increase family engagement
 - Managing multi-age groups
 - Authentic assessment
- Diverse delivery methods for PD

PD Capacity and Access

- Higher education
 - Embedded in coursework
 - Embedded in teaching certification
- Infant/toddler specialized credentials



Career Pathways

- Specialized career lattice for the infant/ toddler workforce
- Infant/toddler credentials embedded
- Career pathways for multiple roles:
 - Family Child Care (FCC) Caregiver
 - Home Visitor
 - Consultant



Technical assistance (TA) activities respond to customized Child Care and Development Fund Lead Agency plan goals in partnership with the Child Care State Systems Specialist Network and other Child Care Technical Assistance Network Partner projects. The PDW Center creates specialized TA tools to support professional development system assessment and strategic decisionmaking, facilitates topical learning communities, and coordinates the work of infant/toddler and school age Communities of Practice. The PDW Center also supports the Administration for Children and Families' (ACF) efforts to explore and address system capacity to increase access to and portability of individual professional credentials.
